

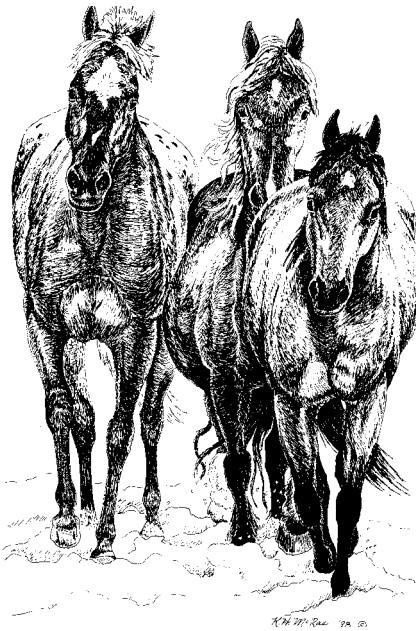

## UPDATE FROM SALE COMMITTEE

Decisions are being made regarding the 2007 CCQHA Sale. Some highlights of the official changes or policies are:

1. The consignment deadline will be moved to July 1, 2007. In order to consign, you must be a member. Be sure your membership is paid or if you are interested in becoming a member, submit your application before June 1, 2007 so the board may take action on it.
2. Consignment forms



will be available online  
at [www.ccqha.com](http://www.ccqha.com) as

soon as they are revised to include all of our revisions.

3. If you plan to consign a horse yearling age or more, it is the policy that the horse must have been owned by you for at least one year. There will be a possibility for exceptions.

4. In order to be eligible for the CCQHA futurity (not Breeder's), a horse must sell in the sale ring and the title must change hands.

ride horses unless the substitution has also been through the selection committee process. This will not apply to yearlings or weanlings.

6. The selection of sale horses will be done by the sale committee shortly after the consignment deadline of July 1st. Video is suggested on yearlings but mandatory on all horses older than a yearling. The video should include front, back, left and right side views of the horses as well as an indication of the horses skills.

7. The mare nomination program will remain in effect again this year. If we get very minimal participation, this program may be dropped. If

so, that will be announced prior to sale time so no horse is sold on the premise that it will be eligible for that program. Any horse already enrolled will remain eligible.

8. No person is guaranteed "spots" in the sale. Consignment information must be submitted completely and in a timely fashion in order to be considered. Due to moving the deadline back, there will not be time for late entries.

9. There is no limit on the number of consignments you may submit. The sale committee will still try to stay within the guidelines of what they feel would be an

appropriate number of horses to sell and an appropriate mix of ages of horses to offer.

10. Consignment fees have increased to \$100. If your horse is not selected, the consignment fee will be returned to you in full.
